
Excerpts from Some of the Greetings to the Sheptytsky Institute on the Occasion of its Twenty-fifth Anniversary


For tradition, contrary to what one may think, is not the past but our present consciousness of a living heritage that has been handed on, and of our obligation to know it, nurture it, and continue to pass it on.

But to do so one must not just know it but also live it. And that is what the Sheptytsky Institute has done so well: not just teaching this rich heritage as arid book-knowledge, but transmitting it as a way of life in its living integrity, always in a spirit of openness and ecumenism in collaboration with the shared riches of our Orthodox Sister Churches. One sees that most clearly in the fact that the Sheptytsky Institute is not just a *learning community*; it is also a *praying community*.

My prayer is that it continue to be so, in a world where few if any do what the Sheptytsky Institute has thus far done so well.


